What paint can I use for...

Walls and ceilings

- matt emulsion
- silk emulsion
- · soft sheen emulsion
- eggshell (water-based)

A bathroom or kitchen

- kitchen and bathroom paint
- emulsion

Outside walls

masonary paint

Woodwork

- knotting reduces the staining that resin in wood can discolour your paintwork
- primer a primer helps to ensure good adhesion to the bare surface before application of undercoats/finishes
- undercoat (water-based or solvent)
- satinwood (water-based or solvent)
- eggshell (water-based or solvent)
- gloss (water-based or solvent)
- non-drip paints
- varnish/woodstain

Radiators and metal

- primer helps reduce the risk of rusting
- · radiator paint/enamel paint
- gloss
- eggshell (water-based or solvent)
- satinwood (water-based or solvent)

Bare plaster

- Use emulsion diluted with one part water to four parts paint or plaster primer.
- Then use two coats of emulsion (see walls and ceilings).
